Woe unto you that are full! for ye shall hunger. Woe unto you that laugh now! for ye shall mourn and weep. Luke 6:25

3 Woes from Jesus (Luke 6:25) (Woe 2) By: Aaron Cozort

Woe to you who are full, For you shall hunger. Woe to you who laugh now, For you shall mourn and weep. Luke 6:25

Jesus continues His woes against certain categories of individuals. This second group is those who are full and laugh. These are being packaged together because they are the experiences of those who live prosperous lives. It is hard to laugh when you're desperate and hungry. When you don't know where your next meal will come from and you did not have one yesterday. When you question which family member will have to go without a meal today so the children can eat. Jesus pronounces a woe upon those who are full. Jesus pronounces a woe upon those who laugh. Both have an emphasis on "now." In other words, those who experience these things on earth.

1. Woe to you who are full... (Luke 6:25a)

Jesus spoke concerning such a man in Luke 16.

"There was a certain rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and **fared sumptuously every day**. "But there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, full of sores, who was laid at his gate, "**desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table.** Moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. (Luke 16:19-21 NKJV)

This man is not identified with a name but with a **condition or status in life**. He is full. Significantly, this man is not condemned because he has **more** than Lazarus. He is condemned because he fails to be a steward of what he has. He fails to realize that what he has never did belong to him but instead belongs to God, and God expects him to serve others.

This certain man who fared sumptuously every day stared in the face of a man who would have satisfied himself with crumbs... and denied him even that. Jesus makes it clear the reverse of this situation will come true when the rich man's master, who gave him everything he has, gets his hands on the rich man.

2. Woe to you who laugh now... (Luke 6:25b)

This woe presents the contrast between those who laugh now because of their state and those who mourn now because of theirs. Poor people can laugh. Rich people can laugh. But laughter flees from those who are abused by others.

The mother whose son is taken by a rich man and sent off to war and dies while the rich man's son sits at home in safety and cannot laugh anymore. A father cannot laugh anymore when he sees his children starving, while the children of the leaders of his land are careless and laugh about their wasteful lifestyle.

Many fathers in Egypt saw their homes decimated, livestock destroyed, houses invaded, and riches plundered while Pharaoh was secure, full, and without need. Only when the firstborn died did Pharaoh finally experience their pain.
